Our Mission Empowering Pacific Islander students to navigate their academic, professional, and personal journeys with confidence and cultural pride — through advocacy, professional development, and community engagement.

The Need PI students in higher education are often underserved and lack culturally competent support systems to help them thrive academically and personally.

Our Approach Five strategic programs: Individual Development Plans, Professional Development Workshops, Hui 'Ohana Nui, Pā'ina Student Dinners, and Hawai'i Service Learning.

<b>Pā'ina Sponsor</b> <span style="float: right;"><b>\$1,000</b></span> Sponsor one students-only dinner in our home — a safe, nourishing space for Pacific Islander students to simply be themselves. Fall (Oct/Nov) or spring (May/Jun). Sponsor both for \$2,000.	<b>Legacy Partner</b> <span style="float: right;"><b>\$31,000</b></span> Fund the Hawai'i Service Learning Trip — an immersive cultural experience reconnecting 15 students with their roots through hands-on service with Hui Mahi'ai 'Āina. Covers all 18 participants (15 students + 3 chaperones).
<b>Builder</b> <span style="float: right;"><b>\$1,875</b></span> Sponsor 1 complete Professional Development Workshop — one session for the entire student cohort.	<b>Pillar Partner</b> <span style="float: right;"><b>\$40,000+</b></span> Sponsor both annual Hui 'Ohana Nui for the full year — becoming the cornerstone community partner of Le Nu'u Legacy Foundation.
