Our Mission: To empower Pacific Islander students to navigate their academic, athletic, and personal journeys with confidence and cultural pride—through advocacy, professional development, and community engagement.

The Need: PI athletes are everywhere in college sports but often lack culturally competent support systems.

Our Approach: Three strategic pillars — five initiatives: Individual Development Plans, Workshop Series, 'Ohana Hui Gatherings, Mataala Voyage (Solomon Islands), and Hawaii Service Learning.

Real Program Costs |

Sponsor 2 'Ohana Hui Gatherings OR fund an entire semester of workshops plus 30+ development plans — transformational, multi-program impact.

Legacy Partner

\$25,000

Fund the Hawaii Service Learning Trip — an immersive cultural experience reconnecting students with their roots through hands-on service at Hui Mahi'ai '■ina.
